14	Poetry: Al-Mutanabbi (<i>Wā Harra Qalbāh</i>)	Lecture	- Memorize 7 selected verses of the poem. - Comprehend linguistic meanings and extract definitions via dictionary.
15	Poetry: Ibn Al-Farid (<i>Jeemiyyah Verses</i>)	Lecture	- Memorize 7 selected verses of the poem. - Analyze literary meanings and expand vocabulary skills.
